I also will and bequeath to my son John one acre of land known by the name of the Hoblet acre and four negroes, Jim Lura and their two children. I also will and bequeath to my son Joseph Jefferson one acre of land where Sanders and the widow formerly lived. Also of this Mrs. Marie and their two children. I also will and bequeath to my son Robert one acre of land wherein I now live together with Tom Chisolm wife Lillie and Lucinda, it is to be understood that this property is to be given up to my children after the death of myself and wife, it is also my will and desire that balance of my estate be sold and equally divided among all my children, it is also my will and desire that my brother Leaven Carson and my son John Carson should act as the executors of this my last will and testament. Signed, Sealed and delivered in the presence of this 23rd day of February 1823.
