All my negroes, that is to say, Kate, Frank and Jerry and my two horses, and all my housing Goods of every kind forever, and that my Will is that each of my lawful heirs have One Silver dollar apiece, and hereby make and Ordain my worthy friend John Flowers Jr. Executor of this my last Will & testament, And I do also make void all other Wills made by me. In Witness whereof I the said John Flowers Sen.^r have to this my last Will & testament.
