In the name of God, Amen, I John Hines of the United States Army being very sick & weak in Body, but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my Body, & knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die, do make & Ordain this my last Will & testament, that is to say principally & first of all, I give or recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God that gave it me, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this life. I give demise & bequeath dispose of the same in the following manner & form. First I give & bequeath to Rachel my dearly beloved & wife, my Bounty of land that is coming to me from the United States for my Services, or long sum or sums of money that may be given in lieu thereof by the United States, together with all my household goods, debts and moveable effects that may remain after all my debts have been paid. Also I constitute make & ordain my friend Jacob R. Brooks the sole

former Will, testament, & legacies Bequeath'd by
me in any wise before named, Hilles, my great Uncle,
and confirming this & no other to be my last Will &
testament I do witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & seal this eleventh day of January in the
year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred & fifteen.
Signed, sealed, published & John Hines (Seal)
pronounced & declared by the mark
