I request and give all the heirs an equal portion with those that

my daughter has received one bed and furniture, one cow and
calf one sow and pigs - In like manner do will the rest of the
heirs distinctly the same, having or claiming said property when
marriage or becoming of age, and those divided tracts viz. one
tract of land lying in Early County one in Criss, and one in Car-
rol County, those three tracts above mentioned, I give an equal
part to those heirs as follows. - Nancy Morris, Sarah Emberson,
Mary Hoskins, Marian Hoskins and Jane Hoskins. I will to my be-
loved wife all the household furniture, and horses with every other
particels that now attached to said premises, without a removal
of any thing until her death and then my son Harrie Hoskins I
give a choice horse and the balance of Horses, stock of every kind
with every attached article of utensils &c. whereof I do hereunto
set my hand this August 22nd A.D.

To my daughter Betsey Tamplin I give and bequeath One dollar.

To my wife Sarah Emerson I leave my house hold and Kitchen furniture - that she may at discretion bestow such parts as she may choose to spare to each of our children now living with us as may seem fit to her, and when arrive at age or marriage may make it necessary.

To my wife Sarah Emerson I leave my Mare, Col and Horse Badger.

To my Son Benjamin I bequeath my Horse Salem

To my Son James Emerson I give and bequeath my little Pilly called Kit

To my wife Sarah Emerson I give and bequeath all my Stock of Cattle hogs and sheep, also stine and cart for her benefit and that of our children residing with her - also all of corn, fodder and plantation tools, also all accounts
