John Minyard's Will

Georgia I know all men by these present that I John Jones County Minyard of the County and State aforesaid, do now constitute and appoint this my last will and Testament and what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bestow on me I dispose of in the following manner Viz. I term of my will and desire is that all my landed estate be equally divided between my three Sons Viz. Jonathan D. M.

James Madina Miniard and George Washington Miniard to be by them fully possessed when they arrive at the age of Twenty one years and the cleared land to be rented until my above named son becomes of age, & above and the proceeds of the rents is to be applied to the education of all my children.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give unto my son Jonathan Miniard a Negro woman named Jessie one saddle and one bay Filly.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> To James Madina Miniard a negro boy named Jacob.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> To George Washington Miniard a Negro boy named Harry.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> To my daughter Elizabeth Miniard I give a certain negro woman Rachel a negro man named Sam, one Frank, and Saddle.

Item 6. To my daughter Martha Ann S. Miniard a negro woman named Ella.

Item 7<sup>th</sup> To my daughter Tabitha Catharin Miniard a negro woman Emily.

Item 8<sup>th</sup> To my daughter Lucinda Miniard a negro man named Bob.

Item 9<sup>th</sup> And my further desire is that all my property not named in this my will, save what their mother desired should be given them viz. The four daughters is to have each of them a needle worked counterpan a piece and the sons three in number, are to have one double, one counterpan and bed quiltte apiece - are to be sold on a credit of twelve months and after paying my just debts is to be equally divided among my children, I mean that my children should be made equal in their negro property, and should any one of the within named negro die, the money so remaining should be applied to make such child equal with the rest, and should any one of the within named negro women have a child or children it is to be sold when the children comes of age, and the money applied as above.

Item 10<sup>th</sup> And further I want all my negroes hired out until the coming of age of them individually, and then they are to receive their wages or negroes as named within, only a certain woman named Rachel is not to be hired, but kept under care and protection of Edwin Colberth for the express purpose of and taking care of my little daughter Lucinda and my desire is that Mr. Colberth take all my children

under his care and protection for the purpose of educating them.  
I want them to have what is called a common farming  
education and I want my brother James Minard to act in  
convent with my brother in law; in educating of them.

I term II - I do ordain, constitute and appoint Simpson Taylor and  
William S. Middlebrooks my temporary Executor to act in set-  
ting my business in this State, and then you are to hand over  
to my brother James Minard and brother in law Edward Culbreth  
both of South Carolina, all my property and effects, to be man-  
aged by them according to my will. Given under my hand  
+ seal this twenty eighth day of August 1829.
