of body though in perfect mind and memory and knowing it is
appointed for all men to die do make and ordain this my last
will and testament.

Item first I give and bequeath to my dear beloved wife Martha
all my Estate both real and personal for the term of four years.
Item Second when my oldest child comes of age or has a proper
agent I wish for her or either of them to have three hundred dol-
lars and also as my sons become of age for to have paid them
the same amount of money.

Item the third If they should marry before the expiration of four
years I wish them to have a bed and furniture.

Item fourth I do further ordain I beloved wife Martha my Exe-
cutrix and Wm. Candler executor of this my last will and testament
in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this first day
of December 1825.

deceased John Simmons pronounce this to be his last
will and testament that she saw him execute it as such and
that she the deponent witness the same witnessed by John
Oliver Benjamin Oliver & Sarah Oliver in the presence of John
Simmons the testator and by his request and also that he the
said John Simmons was of mind perfectly sound and ration-
al at the time.
