Georgia Jones County

I Lewis Wimberly of the State and county aforesaid being of sound mind and memory make & obtain this my last will and testament (to wit) I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Childers one Negro Woman named Agar one negro man named Joe that George Childers the husband of the said Elizabeth have traded by my consent, and a boy named Sonny a boy named Charles a girl named Pleasant and a girl named Patience with the increase of said negroes. I give and bequeath to the heirs of Titus Wimberly Deceased (to wit) Lewis L. Wimberly, Samuel Thomas Wimberly and Milly E. Wimberly all that part of that lot of Land No Eighteen in the Eighth District of Originally Baldwin now Jones County which was not assigned off at the time of my death the widow of the said Titus deceased and after the death of my wife Milly Wimberly I give and bequeath to the heir aforesaid the power in said Lot Eighteen also two negro boys named Peter and Alfred and a girl named Hester with the increase of said negroes. I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Elvira N. Pinson a negro woman named Hasty a man named Anthony and a boy named Ned with the increase of said negroes, I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Wim a negro woman named Dinah a girl named Margaret a boy named Charles a boy named Joe a boy named Bob and a girl named Jude with the increase of said negroes. I loan to my wife Milly Wimberly during her natural life all that part of land wherein I now live with the appurtenances there belonging known as No Seventeen in the eighth District of this Martha Wimberly dwelt in Lot Eighteen in Jones County also a negro man named Jeff a man named Jim a colored boy a woman named Lucy

a boy named Charles and a girl named Becky, after the death  
of my wife I give the said Becky to my daughter Mary W. Brant-  
ly. I also loan my said wife two thirds of my stock of Horses,  
Cattle, Hogs and Sheep, and the other third I give to my son Lewis  
D. Wimberly. I also loan my Gig and Harness to my said  
wife and all my house hold and kitchen Furniture. By Lewis  
D. Wimberly I should Marry before the death of his mother  
Milly Wimberly he is to be fixed to house keeping out of the house  
hold furniture in as good a manner as any of the other children  
that have married and at the death of my wife I give all  
my house hold and kitchen furniture to my son Lewis D. Wim-  
berly. I loan two third of my plantation tools and Gear to my  
wife and the other third I give to my son Lewis D. Wimberly.  
I loan to my son John P. Wimberly the following negroes  
Vilet a man Freeman a man Isaac a boy Thasy a wo-  
man and Rose a girl. My wife Milly Wimberly is to keep my  
son John P. Wimberly with the above named property during  
her life and if the said John P. Should die before his Mother  
She is to have the use of said negroes during her life time,  
and at the death of said Milly Wimberly and also at the death  
of the said John P. Wimberly all the property loaned to them  
that is not otherwise disposed of is to be divided in the fol-  
lowing manner (to wit) After Wimberly's deceased three chil-  
dren to have the one fourth part and Elizabeth Chidlers Mary  
W. Brantly and Lewis D. Wimberly the other three fourths  
equally divided and all my other property that is not dis-  
posed of in this will to be equally divided between the  
four heirs above named after Paying all my just debts.  
I give to my daughter Mary W. Brantly the following neg-  
roes Vilet a woman Emoline a woman Harry a boy Delany  
a girl Sarah a girl and Mike a boy with the Ihere are  
of said negroes I give to my son Lewis D. Wimberly all  
that part of that Lot of Land No. Thirty two in Eighth district  
of originally Baldwin now Jones County lying on the North  
West Side of Anderson Creek containing one hundred and  
fifty acres more or less also one hundred and ninety one and  
one half acres part of lot No. Sixteen and nine in said  
Eighth district. Also three negro men (to wit) Neddy  
Tom and General, also a boy named George a woman  
named Lucy and a girl named Esther and

of said negroes I also will that all my just debts shall be paid by executors herein after appointed in the following manner  
I (test) my Son Lewis D. Wimberly is to have the full Power  
in his own name to sell a lot of Land Drawn by me in the  
Sixteenth district of Early County in any manner that in his  
judgment will be most advantageous and appropriate the money  
to the payment of my debts, my crop of cotton is to be sold and  
put to the use of the payment of my debts. If there should not  
be a sufficiency my wife and my son Lewis D. is to put their  
hands together and plant and cultivate fifty acres of land in  
cotton and sell the same for the payment of part debts and  
at the death of my wife Milly Wimberly the two thirds of my  
Stock of Horses, cattle, Hogs and Sheep to be sold for the pay-  
ment of my debts my crop of corn etc is to be put to the use of  
the family, my waggon and team. I loan to my wife and  
my son Lewis D. and at the death of my wife I give my  
said Waggon and Team to my son Lewis D. Wimberly If there  
should be any over plus in the above appropriation for the  
payment of my debts I give and will it to my son Lewis  
D. Wimberly and I do hereby constitute and appoint my  
wife Milly Wimberly my executrix and my son Lewis D. Wim-  
berly my executor of this my last will and testament, thereby re-  
voking all other wills or bequeaths made by me and making  
and confirming this to be my only true will and testament made  
by me In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
affixed my seal this twenty ninth day of April in the year of

Copy of John Kirk Will.

In the name of God Amen. I John Kirk of the County of  
Jones and State of Georgia of sound mind and memory do  
constitute and ordain this my last will and Testament first  
I commit my soul to God who gave it relying on the atone-  
ment of Christ for its eternal salvation and my body to  
the grave to be decently interred at the discretion of my execu-  
tors as touching my temporal affairs it is my will that they  
be disposed of in the following manner (to wit) first. It is  
my will that the following negroes (to wit) Dennis, Charity, Ab-  
berdeen, Anchey, Harris, Willis and Wiley be sold and the pro-  
ceeds thereof be appropriated to the payment of my just debts  
and if I should there be a surplus left it is my will that my  
mother Anna Kirk have the use of it during her life and then  
to be equally divided between my Brothers and Sisters Sec-  
ondly I bequeath to my beloved Brother Len Kirk one hun-  
dred acres of land known as the McGaugh Place. Thirdly,  
I bequeath to my beloved wife Lucy E. Kirk the whole residue  
of my estate both real and personal to be used and enjoy-  
ed and disposed of at her will and pleasure and that Lucy E.  
Kirk and William Kirk be my Executrix and Executor to car-  
ry this my last will and testament into effect. In witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal  
this 3<sup>rd</sup> October 1825.
