

Littleberry King's Will.

In the name of God, Amen. I Berry King of the State of Georgia Jones County being well in Body & a perfect mind & memory thanks be to God. Calling to mind the Mortality of my Body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last Will & testament, that is to say, principally & first of all I give & recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it me, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors, knowing but at the general Resurrection I shall rise the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate herewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, after all my just debts are paid I give and devise and divide of the same in the following manner & form. First I give & bequeath to Mary my beloved Wife One feather Bed & furniture, and also to be supported her life time on the property I leave & let her retain the feather Bed & furniture to be given to my daughter Mary, and to my daughter Betsy I give & bequeath One horse & colt & bed & furniture her life time, and then to her two children James & Martha. And to my daughter Isabell I give & bequeath, One feather Bed & furniture, and an equal division of all the Cattle and Hogs to be divided between herself and Betsy at my death, and at their death to be equally divided between their children, and to my Son John I give & bequeath One Negro Woman named Jemima, and one Sorel Mare, and to daughter Mary I give & bequeath one Negro Woman named Lott & one Colt, and my land to be for the use of my wife & all the above mentioned Children, as long as they or the said place live. And to my daughter Mary Williams I give & bequeath one dollar. I also constitute make & ordain James Miller & John King my Son the sole Executor of this my last Will & testament and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, & disannul all & every former testament, will, legacy, bequeath-

and Executors by me in any wise before made, settled
& bequeathed. Ratifying & Confirming this & no others to
be my last Will. On witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & seal this 13th day of June in the year
of our Lord 1812, and in the 36th year of American Inde-
pendence.

John Trice's Will.

In the name of God, Amen, I John Trice of the County
of Jones in the State of Georgia being weak in Body,
but of sound & perfect memory, blessed be God for the
same; do publish and make this my last Will & testa-
ment in the manner following, That is to say, First
I give & Bequeath to my son James Trice all the lot of
land wherous he now lives containing two hundred
two & a half acres lying in the ninth district of
Baldwin County which is now Jones County no one
hundred & fifty eight; that said lot of land shall
be all he the said James Trice shall ever have of
my estate should amount to more than thirty
one hundred dollars then he the said James Trice
shall have an equal part of the balance. And I do
further Will that remainder of my estate which
may remain after paying all my just debts & the
Legacy & Bequest above mentioned, shall be left
