Body do make & obtain this my last Will & Testament
in manner & form following, that is to say, I give
my Body to the Earth to be entered in a Christian
manner, and resign my soul to God who gave it
to me, and ^{all} my worldly Estate I dispose of as follows,
after all my Just Debts are satisfied. I term I give
unto my well beloved daughter Sally Ray five Shil-
lings to her & her heirs forever. I term, I give ^{unto} my well
beloved son Richard Long five shillings to him and
his heirs forever. I term, I give unto my well beloved
son Drury Long five shillings to him & his heirs for-
ever. I term, I give unto my well beloved daughter
Elizabeth D. Long one Note, or three hundred dollars
upon my son Drury Long, also one Bed & furniture to
her & heirs forever, also one Heifer. I term, I give unto
my well beloved son Jesse Lee Long one Negro boy
named Mike only he shall pay to my son Littleton
Long out of the value of said Negro fifty dollars
in one year after my decease. I term I give unto my
well beloved son John Long one Bed & furniture to him
& his heirs forever, also three Cows & Calves and ^{all} my
Stock of hogs to him and his heirs forever. I term, I give
unto my two Children John Long and Elizabeth Long all
my household and Kitchen furniture to be divided at
the discretion of my two friends Littleton Long & James
Chappell. I do hereby appoint my son Littleton Long
and James Chappell as Executors of this my last
Will & Testament as Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & affixed my seal this 16th day of October
One thousand eight hundred & ten, and 33 Year of
of the Independence of the United States of America.

In the name of God, Amen, I Joel M^c Clendon who is
Weak in Body, but of sound in mind & memory, do
make this my last Will & Testament. First of all my
just debts^{to} be paid out of the debts due me. Then I
give & bequeath to my beloved Wife Lucy M^c Clendon
all my household & Kitchen furniture, Working tools,
Cattle, Hogs & the one eyed mare & old Negroe Dolly
to her forever to dispose of as she thinks proper; also I give
my Negroe Woman Mary to my beloved daughter Elizabeth
Kirk M^c Clendon forever; then I give to my beloved
Son Joel M^c Clendon my land & plantation I pur-
chased from Langford, Owen & Cart & the bay mare already
called his; But let it be understood that my Wife
is to have peaceable possession of the land & plan-
tation during her Widowhood, And the bay colt to be
raised by the family while he is four years old
and then at the discretion of my Wife & what he
fetches given to Daniel Jefferson son to Lemmy Mason,
and after my money is collected from the heirs
of John Williams and from the Agency for property
Stolen by the Indians, then that money to be
equally divided between my Wife and three daugh-
ters A. Sholes, N. Harris, & P. Lee and Marvel and
