In the name of God Amen I Mary Philips widow of Solomon  
Philips late of Jones County Georgia deceased, calling to  
mind that mortality must put on immortality and that  
it is appointed for all mortals once to die & being of sound  
mind & disposing memory do make & ordain this my last  
will & testament as follows (to wit) first of all after my  
decease that my body be decently interred, and my burial  
expenses be speedily paid, and that my just debts be as  
speedily paid as circumstances will admit. - Secondly  
to my sons Joseph Cowen & Wm A. Cowen & my daughter  
Mary Cowen, I will that all my estate both real & per-  
sonal, that I may be in possession of at the time of my  
decease as may be entitled to, be equally divided amongst  
them. And lastly I nominate & appoint my two sons Joseph  
Cowen & Wm A. Cowen my executors to this my last will &  
testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
& seal this 9<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord one  
thousand eight hundred & eighteen.
