Morris County } In the name of God Amen, I Nathaniel Morris of Jones County and State aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament as follows — First — After my death it is my will that all my legal debts be paid off by my Executor, and that he be authorized to sell at Public outcry enough of my personal property for that purpose — Second — After the payment of my debts my wife Nancy Morris shall have the profits arising from the lands and negroes, for her support during her natural life and should there be more than sufficient for that purpose, the surplus shall be equally divided among my three children Thomas W. Morris, Richard Morris and Frances Morgan — Third — At the death of my wife or her marriage then all my property both real and personal shall be sold by my Executor

one third reserved and kept in the hands of my Executor for the support of my daughter Frances, and the balance equally divided among my two sons Thomas W and Richard Morie. Fourth I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint John L Lewis of Jones County my Executor to execute this my last will & testament.

the uncertainty of life and the certainty death do this day ordain constitute and appoint this my last will and testament and do by virtue of these presents dispose of the worldly goods that God has been pleased to bestow on me in the following manner to wit — First I item — I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha Mitchell one square of land lying in the twelfth district of originally Baldwin now Jones County containing 202 1/2 acres, the square that I now live on, one sorrel mare and colt and one gray filly, two choice cows and calves, all of my stock of Hogs, four head of sheep and all of my house hold and kitchen furniture and all of my plantation tools with my cotton crop now standing but corn, cotton and every thing else I have and to hold during her natural life for
