#### Nehemiah Dunn's Will

In the name of God Amen Nehemiah Dunn, of the State  
of Georgia, and County of Jones, being weak of body but of  
sound mind & memory hereby revoking all other wills, do  
make and ordain this my last will & Testament in the man-  
ner following (to wit)

I term 1<sup>st</sup> I bind to my beloved wife Anna Dunn during  
her natural life all that part of the tract of Land whereon  
I now reside in the County aforesaid lying South of Shoal  
Creek between said Shoal Creek Hog Creek & Cedar Creek to-  
gether with the privilege of the mills and mill seats on said  
Shoal creek up to high water mark on the other side. also  
bound unto her my said wife Anna Dunn two negroes named  
Jack and Ritter and one Black Horse with half the Stock  
of Hogs and cattle, that I may be in possession of at any  
Death and as much of my household & kitchen furniture  
as I may think proper to retain and each of my son-  
ried children to be furnished with one horse and 2 h.  
one bed & furniture and two cows and cattle &c.

ance of my Stock and furniture at the time of their marrying or  
when needed.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> It is my will that at the death of my beloved wife Anna  
Dunn the above named negroes Jack and Nitta together with  
the Stock of cattle Hogs House hold and kitchen furniture to  
be sold and the money be equally divided between my daughters

Item 3<sup>d</sup> It is my will that the following negroes (To wit) march  
click, Amy Lucy, Caesar Anderson, Philia, George, Adeline, Bob & Lick  
together with all those that I have let out in the hands of my  
children (To wit) Linda <sup>wimmy</sup> Lick Anna and her child William Old  
Bill Lewis and Sam be at a broken time after my death collected  
together and appraised by three men who I shall hereafter name  
in this my will and to equally divide between each of my daughters  
agreeable to valuation (the value of the aforesaid Wimmy  
to be considered as having been given to my daughter Rebecca)  
allowing those who now have any of the said negroes in pos-  
session to retain them at their valuation if they choose also any  
that I may hereafter let out to my children to be kept by those  
who have them at their valuation as aforesaid.

Item 4. I give unto my Son Elijah A. Dunn the privilege  
of Setting on and cultivating any part of that part of my  
land named in the first Item of this will with the full use  
of the Saw Mill and timber on said tract during the natural  
life of his Mother with the exception that she is to enjoy the  
free use of the plantation under cultivation the dwelling house  
and appertaining thereto the Grist mill and Cotton Machines  
and that if my said Son Elijah Shall attend to & keep in re-  
pair the said Grist mill he Shall be entitled to one sixth part  
of the profits arising from the same and Shall have a part  
in the use of the cotton Machine.

and at the death of her my said beloved wife Anna he my said  
son Elijah Shall be vested in the full right and title to said  
land and premises upon his paying two thousand dollars  
in two equal annual instalments the first payment to be one  
year after the death of his Mother the said two thousand dollars  
to be equally divided between each of my daughters

It is my will that after my death all that part of the  
land wherein I now reside lying north of Shool Creek  
(on the side of the hill as far as high water mark excepted)  
and in Waller County No 71 just district con-

leaving two hundred and fifty acres to be sold at the discretion  
of my executors as they may deem most advantageous and the  
proceeds equally divided between my daughters

Item 6 It is my will that the money which is due to me  
from William Wright in Columbia County be collected and my  
Cotton now on hand be sold unless sold by myself and the  
money applied to the payment of all my just debts after which  
I wish one hundred and twenty five dollars to be paid to Joseph  
Day one hundred dollars to James Calhoun an fifty Dollars  
to Samuel Wining it being the amount of money paid by  
them for negroes which I set them have also that if I or  
my executors should have to pay the amount of note for which  
list is instituted against me in favor of Patrick Calhoun for  
Land of James Scott that then the same be deducted out of the  
part that would otherwise go to my daughter Sarah Scott

Item 7 I hereby authorize and appoint Peter Wyche Jesse McRorie  
Pope & Miles Scarborough to value the negroes as named in  
the third Item and divide them by lot or otherwise to the best  
advantage and my daughters that may be left after the above  
named dispositions to be equally divided between my daughters  
as aforesaid

Item 8 I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife  
Anna Dunn Executrix and Joseph Day Executor to carry in  
to effect this my last Will and Testament

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and af-  
fixed my seal this Seventeenth day of April one thousand eight  
hundred and Twenty One.

Share + Share a like I also leave unto my wife the following  
Negroes a fellow named Skiff + Fainey his wife also my large  
bay Mare which said Negroes + Mare the Out Rent and at her  
death to do with them as she thinks proper or she may wish  
I term and give to my son Washington McFarlin the Negro woman  
named Phillie.

I term and give to my son Peter McFarlin a negro girl by the  
name of Charlott -

I term + give to my son Aaron H. McFarlin a negro Fellow  
named Ceaser -

I term + give unto my son Harry McFarlin a negro boy by  
the name of Jim.

I term + give my daughter Martha W. McFarlin the negro girls  
named Anna + Mariah also a bay horse called Tom + her  
bed + furniture + Lunk.

I term + give all my household + kitchen Furniture to my wife  
+ sons to Peter, Aaron H. + Harry and my daughter Martha W.  
McFarlin to be kept together for their mutual benefit so long  
as they stay together and at the death of my wife for it to be  
equally divided + sold and then divided shear + shear a like  
among my sons Peter, Aaron H. + Harvey and my daughter  
W. McFarlin to them + their heirs for ever -

and my stock of every description (not all ready to sell)  
and tools and all the farming utensils
