Peter Wyche's Will.

Know all men by these presents that I Peter Wyche of the state of Georgia Jones County Calning to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life. Being weak in body but in perfect mind and memory have thought proper this 15th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three to make and ordain this my last will and testament.

1st I give all my just debts paid as soon as my present crop is sold.

2nd I give to my Son Christopher Wyche one negro boy named Sam.

3rd I give to my Son Alfred Wyche one negro boy named Anthony one good horse one good feather bed and furniture and one decent suit of clother to be paid for out of the present crop.

4th I give to my Son Albert Wyche one negro boy named George one good horse saddle and bridle and one good feather bed and furniture and one decent suit of clother to be paid for out of the present crop.

5th I give to my Son John R. Wyche one negro boy named Luke one good horse saddle and bridle and one good feather bed and furniture.

6th I give to my Daughter Frances Wyche one negroe girl named Lina one good feather bed and furniture.

7th I give to my Son Peter McDougal Wyche one negroe girl named Harriet and one negro boy named Austin.

8th I leave one tract of Land in Jasper County together with three negroes namely Daniel, Liagan & Lived. In case certain suit now pending in the Superior Court for the County against Henry Wyche principal and may self security for J. D. witness & co. If said suit should go against me then the above property to be sold on a credit so as to meet the payment of said debt and should said debt

me I wish Daniel and Eliza to be sold and the money arising from
the sale to be laid out in the purchase of other negroes or land
9th I give to my wife Susannah Wyche during her natural life
or widowhood the tract of land wherein I now live. I y^t not dis-
posed of by my executors but I leave it in their power to dis-
pose of the same provided they can purchase a place that will
be more convenient for her to live on. Also thirteen negroes
namely Tom, Dolly, Betty, Zack, Katy, Fanny, Jemmy, Daniel, Trigg
I sage, Eliza, Edy and Beck. Together with my stock of Horses
Cattle and Hogs plantation tools household and kitchen furniture
for use and raising and educating my children and furnishing
those within named with Horses Beads &c. But in case my
wife should inter marry then the above named property to be taken
out of her possession, except the land and so much of the other prop-
erty as may be adjudged by the court having cognizance thereof to be
sufficient for her decent support during her natural life as be-
fore named. Also a sufficient quantity of corn fodder and bark
for the support of my whole family for the ensuing year and
at the death of my said wife I wish all the property left to her
to be equally divided first paying all my daughters one hun-
dred dollars each except my first Daughter Abigail P. Colvert
to whom I give fifty dollars in addition to what I have already
given her. Then an equal division to take place by lot if it con-
veniently can and if not to be sold in a crest of twelve months
to the highest bidder and the proceeds to be divided between
Henry Wyche Milley Batterwhite Rebekah Lickner Christopher
C. Wyche Alfred Wyche Albert Wyche Elizabeth C. Dene John R.
Wyche Frances Wyche and Peter McDorrough Wyche.

Georgia I in the name of God Amen I Solomon L Slatter soner County of the County and state aforesaid being in perfect mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed unto all men and women once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament.

Item 1st I give my soul to God who gave it and my body to the dust from whence it came containing in the merits of Jesus Christ for a joyful resurrection.

Item 2nd As to my worldly goods in my will and desire that they be disposed of and I do hereby dispose of them in the following manner

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Lucy C. Slatter all of my property with an exception of a negro man born both real and personal that may be remaining after my just debts are paid.

Item 4th I give unto my beloved brother Hadache F. Slatter a negro man named Tom by his giving up a mortgage on said negro to my wife Lucy C. Slatter

Item 5th I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother F. Slatter my Executor of this my last will and testament and acknowledging this alone to be my last will and testament.

Item 6th I desire that my Executor may dispose of my movable property & as much of my land as will pay my just debts testifying whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of November 1824.
