Robert Cutters Will.

Be it known to all and country I in the name of God Omnipotent Robert Cutters of the state and county aforesaid being sick of body but of mind and a failing memory do make this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows — I give my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping in a happy resurrection the merits and atone-
ment of his son Jesus Christ. And my worldly estate which the Lord has been pleased to bless me I give and de-
vise as follows —

1st To my beloved son George Cutters I give and bequeath one tract of land already received at four hundred dollars forever.

2nd To my beloved son Thomas Cutters I give and bequeath one negro boy named Dick already received at four hundred dollars forever —

3rd I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Andrew Cutters one negro boy by the name of Ben already re-
ceived at four hundred dollars forever —

4th To my beloved daughter Polly Jane Cutters I give and bequeath two negro girls Betty and Cicy at four hundred not yet Rec'd also one bay mare one saddle and bridle
one feather bed Stead and furniture one Red cow and her
incresce the same being six in number now and should
the said Jane die leaving no issue the whole of my bequests
to her shall be equally divided between my surviving heirs —

5th To my beloved daughter Nancy Whitesides I give and be-
queath two negro girls already Rec'd at eight hundred dollars
to have and use during her natural life and at her death to be
equally divided between the heirs of her body —

6th To my beloved Grandsons Cyprian and Robert Sims I give one hundred dollars to be equally divided between them at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named.

7th To my beloved wife Jane Cruthers I give and bequeath my dwelling house one hundred and twenty acres of land around the dwelling of her own choosing also the negro Ben & all my two feather beds and furniture the house clock the side board the tables the chairs the chest the kitchen furniture the two miles plantation as many as she may want eight head of choice cattle ten head of choice fattening hogs two sows and sixteen shoats all choice to have as her own right and property during her natural life and afterwards to be equal between my surviving heirs also corn and fodder of the present crop sufficient for the next year.

8th The residue of the dwelling house and the residue of my land and property not herein mentioned (the negroes excepted) I wish sold as soon as it can legally be done for the benefit of my heirs and creditors after the payment of my just debts and making all my children equal with Nancy Whittemore it is my will that at the negroes of my estate shall be mentioned be appraised by two or more free and peaceable persons chosen by myself before for the purpose and later equally among my children with the exception that Cyprian and Robert Sims my Grandsons above mentioned shall have the entire benefit of their mother Nancy Whittemore but for to board and school them to be managed by their lawful guardian.

9th It is my special will and request that my youngest daughter Jane and her property continue with her mother during her unmarried life.

Lastly to the end that the affairs of my estate may be managed according to the spirit and meaning of this my last will and testament I do hereby ordain constitute and appoint my trusty friend James Billingslea and my son Andrew Cruthers executors of the same I no witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and annexed my seal this seventeenth day of Nov in the year of our Lord 1825.

has not been mentioned in these my last will and testam-
