Robert M. J. Mitchell's Will

State of Georgia Know all men by these present That I Robert
Jones County M. J. Mitchell of the county and state aforesaid
being this day of sound mind & memory but calling to mind
the uncertainty of life and the certainty death
to this day ordain constitute and appoint this my last will
and Testament and do by virtue of these presents dispose of the
worldly goods that God has been pleased to bestow on me in
the following manner to wit — First I term — I give and bequeath
unto my beloved wife Martha Mitchell one square of land lying
in the twelfth district of originally Baldwin now Jones County con-
taining 200^{1/2} acres the square that I now live on, one sorrel mare
and colt and one gray filly, two choice cows and calves, all of
which of Hogs four head of sheep and all of my house hold
when furniture and all of my plantation tools with
a crop now standing but corn, cotton and every
other crop and to hold during her natural life for

the purpose of raising my children and them to be sold and the money to be equally divided between them share and share —
Second Item — My will further is that all of my property both real and personal should be sold and after paying my just debts (that is, that is not given to my wife) and the money equally divided between my children the sale to take place at the discretion of my executor to be herein after named.

Third Item — I have given some of my children some little property say a house a bed &c my will is that they all shall be made equal of the monies arising from the sale of my first property — Fourth Item — I further ordain constitute and appoint George S. F. Mitchell and Ranson Mitchell my sole sole Executors to carry this my will into effect.
