Samuel Bell's Will.

Know all men by these presents that I Samuel Bell of the state
of Georgia and county of Jones Calling to mind the certainty of death
and the uncertainty of life being in a low state of health but in
perfect mind & memory have thought proper this 16th day of Febru-
ary one thousand eight hundred & twenty six to make and publish
this my last will & Testament revoking all others heretofore
made by me

first I give to my brother Isaac C. Bell two notes of bond on
Abner Fisher of the estate of north Carolina Camden County Al-
so all other notes or open accounts which are due me either
in the state of North Carolina or in the state of Georgia to-
gether with all other property whatsoever belonging to me. Be
my said Brother paying all my just debts as soon as he
can collect money from the named notes and accounts and
the balance he is to convert to his own use and benefit and I
do hereby appoint my said Brother my lawful executor to this
my last will and Testament.

James Blount's Will

Georgia } In the name of God Amen! I James Blount of the
Jones County, aforesaid State & County being of good health of body
& sound disposing mind & memory thanks be to almighty God for
his mercies but calling to mind the mortality of my body & know-
ing that it is ordained for all men once to die, do this twelfth day
of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and nineteen make & declare this my last will and testament
in manner & form following. Item I will & bequeath to my well
beloved wife Elizabeth Blount one square of land lying on
big cedar creek in Jones County known by number 128 join-
ing the lands of Mitchell Warrum & others which I bought of
Charles Burdette Esq. containing two hundred two and a half
acres to her & her heirs forever. I also give my wife Elizabeth
Blount the following negro slaves viz. Pompey & his wife Hannah,
one young negro man Burdison & a girl named Mary, one
dark bay mare called Jim & one mule her choice two beds bed-
steads & furniture, one trunk her choice six chairs two sets
floor gears one gig & harness all the salt sugar & coffee
which may be in the house at the time of my decease, one
cow & calf or yearling & one thousand dollars to be paid
her in cash as soon as it can be collected by my execu-
tor. to be hereafter named also should my death take
place in the fall of the year or winter one hundred bar-
rels corn & two thousand pounds of pork or in like proportion
from the time that event may take place, I also give her all
the crockery china or glass ware which may be in the house
at that time, one mahogany candle stand one pine table and
spinning wheel one Reel 2 axes 2 grub hoes & 2 weeding hoes &
all the poultry, provided she should comply with a clause to be
hereafter inserted respecting the lands which have descended
to her by the death of her brother John Mark Gregorie Roul-
hac.

Item I give & bequeath to beloved son John Mark Roulhac
Blount the following negro slaves viz. Enoch & his wife
& her three children Lucy Frank & Linsney to him & his
heirs also one hundred dollars in cash to be paid him
