In the name of God Amen -

I Sarah Helton of the county Jones and State of Georgia do
make and ordain this my last will and Testament here-
by revoking and disannulling all others heretofore made
being in a low State health but of sound mind and dis-
posing mind and memory - and calling to mind that it
is appointed for all men once to die, do first of all give my
Soul to God, who gave it and my body to Earth from
whence it came I then I give and bequeath to my Sister
Rebecca Helton all my clothing and household furniture
that I may be possessed of to wit, all my wearing apparel
and my bed clothing also my chest and table and
chair also my Spider and Skillet my bedstead and
pail and Tub likewise my side saddle, I then I give
and bequeath also to my said Sister Rebecca my cow
and pigs, my reasons for so doing are that my said Sis-
ter Rebecca - has been sole attendant in my last sick-
ness, and indeed like a servant, I then the rest of my
property I leave to pay my ^{pet} debts and funeral expenses,
In Witness whereof I have unto set my hand and seal

in presence of the subscribing witnesses whom I have re-
quested to witness the same this 2nd day of May 1826 the words
all & just was interlined before signed and
Signed and Sealed in the presence of us)

Richard Harris's Will

Georgia } Be it known that I Richard J Harris of
Jones County } the County and State aforesaid being in a Sound
State of Mind and body but knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die do make the following disposition of my
property as my last will and testament. Viz - 1st I leave unto
my beloved wife Martha M Harris the house and Square of
land on which I now live together with twenty acres adjoin-
ing Briland to have and to use during her widowhood only
and it is further my will that she have an equal share
with my children of all my other property according to Law
the negroes which were willed to me by Edwin Harris excep-
ted - 2nd I give and bequeath to my five children Nathan
Harris, Nancy Harris, Edwin Noble Harris, Frances Decatur
Harris and Elizabeth Turner Harris, the negroes that were
willed to me by Edwin Harris together with their increase
to be equally divided among them and I further give and
bequeath to my five children aforesaid and their heirs for-
ever all my other property both real and personal to be equal-
ly divided amongst them. It is further my will that my
two negro men Rodrick and Jerry be sold by my Executors
immediately after my death and the proceeds of the Sale at
that time be divided equally among my five children
It is further my will and desire that so
