

last Will and testament, 2ndly I wish all of my property kept together for the use and support of my family and thirdly I wish no sale of any part of my perishable property, house hold and kitchen furniture, and Stock of any description during the natural life or widow hood of my wife Ann Morris - And fourthly In case of her dying or moving there an equal division of my whole estate to be divided between my wife and children and they all to share and share alike - And fifthly in case my wife marries, the balance of the estate will be divided between my children; as the oldest becomes of age, for him to have his portion and so on to the next oldest, till the youngest becomes of age. Sixthly, My wife Father and Mother to live on the plantation and be supported out of my estate, during their natural lives - And lastly I appoint my wife Ann Morris my Executor of this my last will and testament. I am witness whereof, hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of February, Eighteen hundred and thirty one.

In the name of God amen. I Shadrack Gooding knowing
that it is appointed unto man once to die, but being in perfect
mind and memory, have thought fit to make this my last
will and testament, revoking all others heretofore made by
me. I give and bequeath unto my son James the
tract of land, whereon I now live containing the number of

and forty two and a half acres. the land to be sold and the money to be equally divided between them James C. Goodwin, Jr. & Gideon Goodwin and Ruffin L. Goodwin to them and their heirs forever. I also give and bequeath unto my son James a negro woman named Ruth and a negro girl named Susan, to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my son James C. Goodwin a negro boy named Adam to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Gideon Goodwin a negro boy named Alfred to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Ruffin L. Goodwin two negro girls one of them named Nancy, and the other named Sarah to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Calhoun one cow and calf, to her and heir forever.

I will and bequeath unto my two youngest sons Gideon and Ruffin L. Goodwin, all my house hold furniture.

I will that after my death my Stock of all kind, such as horses, horned cattle, sheep, hogs and flocks with my kitchen furniture and plantation tools be sold, to the highest bidder, and that all my just debts be paid, and the balance of the proceeds be equally divided between my four above named Sons.

I will and bequeath unto my Son in law William Barnes one dollar and a negro girl named Rachel which I have already given him since his intermarriage with my daughter Mary Goodwin.

I will and bequeath unto my three Grandsons Hardy Oliver, one dollar John Oliver one dollar and William Oliver one dollar with what I gave their mother at and since her marriage.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint my two Sons James C. Goodwin and Gideon Goodwin as my lawful Executors to this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand in common form this the 11th day of November A.D. Eighteen hundred and twenty eight.

Georgia I on the name of God Amens. I Zachariah Hester
of the County of the County beforewile being weake in body but
of sound and disposing mind and memory, am taking
into consideration that it is appointed unto all men once
to die, & to make and publish their last will and testa-
ment in manner and form following, to wit, first I desire
to return my soul to God who gave it, and my body to be
buried in a decent and Christian like manner under the
discretion of my executors. And as to what worldly effects
it has pleased God to bless me with. My will is that first
of all my just debts be specially paid from the proceeds
of my present crop, and my standing debts.

Secondly. I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Bi-
one Hester the plantation whereon now live with all the
lands therunto belonging. All my house hold and kitchen
furniture, plantation utensils (except two good feather beds
and furniture) and four Negroe Slaves, to wit, Garland, Nel-
ly, Seal and Nell, two horses to wit, Sealm and Hester, my
stock of cattle and hogs (except three good cows and calves)
and the remaining proceeds of my crop after all my
just debts shall have been paid.

Thirdly - I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved daughter
Isabella ~~Jones~~ Jones and my son in law John Jones one
lot of land lying in the tenth district of Upson County, lot
ninety seven and three negroe slaves to wit Rose, Norris
and Duke. My bay mare and mule Cott, three good cows
and calves, and one good feather bed and furniture.

Fourthly, I give bequeath and devise to my beloved son Wil-
liam B. Hester one lot of land lying in the twelfth district
of Triong County lot no 268 two hundred and sixty eight
and three negroe slaves to wit Isham, Ann (both delived to
her in my life time) and Sarah my son James and
