In the name of God Amen, I Simson Horn of State of Georgia
and Jones County being of Perfect health and of sound mind and
memory but recollecting that it is appointed for man to
die do make and ordain this my last will and testa-
ment first I recommend my soul to God who gave it and
my body to be buried with Decent Christian burial.

I then 1st Give and bequeath to my son Olyah Horn one
hundred three and a half acres of land adjoining Hinchy
Sany and Simmons to him and his heirs forever.

I then 2^d I Give and bequeath to my son Joel Horn eighty eight
and one quarter acres of land adjoining the Square of land

I now give over to him and his heirs forever.

Item 3^d I Give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Hiker five dollars

Item 4th I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Horn all the rest of my property both real and personal during her natural life or widowhood then the whole to be equally divided among all my surviving children except Sally Hiker she having received her portion, provided my wife Elizabeth should marry then it is my wish she should have one negro woman named Mary to her and her heirs forever.

Lastly reposing special confidence in my beloved wife Elizabeth Horn I do appoint her whole and sole executrix unto this my last will and testament witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed hand & seal the 19th Octo. 1816.
