after my just debts are paid.

Item 4th I give unto my beloved brother Shadrach F. Slatter
a negro man named Tom by his giving up a mortgage
on said negro to my wife Lucy C. Slatter.

Item 5th I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother
F. Slatter my Executor of this my last will and testament
and acknowledging this alone to be my last will and testa-
ment.

Item 6th I desire that my Executor may dispose of my perish-
able property & as much of my land as will pay my just debts
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this 1st day of November 1824.
