Georgia. In the name of God Amen. I Spencer Owens of Jones County, the County and State aforesaid being in bad health but possessing my common mind and judgment and calling to mind the mortality of my body and the uncertainty of life do hereby make this instrument of writing as my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say, first I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave me existence, and my body to a Christian decent burial at the discretion of my Executors, who I hereunto nominate and appoint —

First I give to my daughter Sarah Sharp one Dollar.

2nd I give to my daughter Mary Bonner one Dollar —

3rd I give to my son Peter Owens one Dollar

4th I give to my son Jonathan Owens one Dollar

5th I give to my daughter Elizabeth Cooper a certain Duro colored cow & her calf a kind of black colour

6th I give to my son Purval Owens a certain black cow and her calf of pided color and a feather bed and furniture and one half of the Tract of Land whereon I now live also one small cob —

7th I give to my son Spencer Owens Junior the other half of the land whereon I now live —

8th I give to my grandson David Cooper a Brindle cow —

hindle heifer something the size of one year old -

9th I give to Dacey Storey a Bed -

10th I give to my Dear Beloved Wife Mary Owens a certain brown coloured mare and all my stock of cattle and hogs except the cow and calf which I have before given to my daughter Elizabeth Cooper and the cow and heifer which I have given to my grand-son David Cooper and all the farming utensils with all the house- hold and kitchen furniture and the present crop of corn fodder &c dur- ing her natural life and to be at her disposal and after her death I wish all this Chattel property or so much as may remain on hand to be equally divided between my two sons Purnal Owens and Spencer Owens ^{junior} except such property as has already been named and given to others before mentioned -

11th I do nominate and appoint my loving Wife Mary Owens and my son Purnal Owens as my Executors of this my last will and testament and I do wish those said Executors to pay and dis- charge as soon as may be in their power out of the before men- tioned property or other wise all the lawful Debts which I may be owing in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2^d day of September A.D. 1822.
