I give to John Reynolds also one fourth of the balance of my estate. And appoint my sons Larkin Reynolds and John Reynolds my Executors to this my last will. Whereof I do possess a sound mind and memory and have this day set my hand and affixed my seal this 27th day of September in the year of Our Lord eighteen hundred & thirty three.

and personal, however not to be subject to any debt which he
now owes, or which he may at any time hereafter contract,
and after his death to be sold and the proceeds of the sale to be
equally divided between all my Grand Children then in life and
those who stand in the stead of such as may then be dead,
share and share alike to them and their heirs forever.

And Lastly, I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint my
brother Travis A. D. Weaver my Ex^r to execute this my last will
and Testament.
