I Thomas Johnson of the County of Chatham and State of Georgia aforesaid Planter Being in good health and sound mind memory and understanding, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs whilst I have capacity so to do, Do make publick pronouce and declare this to be my last will and testament. Hereby revoking and making void all former or other will by me at any other time hereafter made and first I recommend my Soul to my creator who gave it, and my body to be decently interred by my Executors herein after named. And as to such estate as I may be possessed of after payment of my funeral expences and all my just and lawful debts, I dispose of in the manner following. I give to my wife Hamital Johnson all that I possess at my death after my debts are paid to have and to hold as long as she doth live and at her death to give to whomsoever she pleases. And I do appoint Hamital Johnson my lawful Executor and Robert Habersham and Joseph Habersham Esquire my lawful Executors of this my last will and Testament, trusting in their fidelity & friendship as to the true executions and contents thereof.
