I give to my son Jonathan Watson for and during his natural life the use and possession of all my estate both real and personal, however not to be subject to any debt which he now owes, or which he may at any time hereafter contract, and after his death to be sold and the proceeds of the sale to be equally divided between all my grand children then in life and those who stand in the stead of such as may then be dead, share and share alike to them and their heirs forever.

And Lastly, I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint my brother Train A. D. Weaver my Ex^r to execute this my last will & Testament.

2nd It is further my will and desire that the residue

3rd I wish my stock, farming utensils, house hold and kitchen furniture, corn fodder crop should there be any made and such other things as may be necessary for an equal division sold at public sale -

4th I do hereby appoint my beloved friend Harrison Patterson my lawful Executor to take charge and manage the same to the best advantage - In testimony whereof I do hereby set my hand and seal in the presence of this 14th day of April 1835.
