I tem⁶ I will that Phillis Peter and Delph my plantation and all my land stock of all kind with my household furniture plantation utensils be sold to the highest bidder at twelve months credit taking small notes with approved security and when collected and Eight hundred dollars paid to Rachel Armstrong then the balance to be equally divided between John Dennis William Dennis and Peter Dennis. I tem⁷ and lastly I nominate John Dennis William Dennis Peter Dennis and James Jones Esq. Executors of my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th October 1816.

In the name of God amen, I John Adkerson of the County of Green and State of Georgia being of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate that it hath pleased God to bless me with. I do give and bequeath the same in manner and form following that is to say I give to my beloved wife Denny Atkinson all my estate both real and personal after giving my two sons one hundred dollars a piece that is to say Benjamin & Adkerson and ^{Samuel} C. Adkerson. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Robert Gilliam and George Stovall Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others or former testaments by me here tofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this thirteenth day of December 1803 signed sealed published and declared as and for the last will and testament of the above named John Adkerson in presence of us.
