the Earth, and that my funeral expences be speedily
paid. Item I Will that all my just debts be as speed-
ily paid as the circumstances of things will admit. Item
I Will unto my beloved Wife Nancy Stone all my estate
that remains after paying my just debts, both real
+ personal, during her Widowhood, to be equally divided
amongst my Children at her death, or intermarriage. Item
I Will that my Executors give of to all my Children as
they arrive at age or marry as in their Opinion can be
spared them as much of their proportional part as circum-
stances will admit of. Item, I Will that my Executors dis-
pose of my joiners tools, as much of the farming tools
as can be conveniently spared from the use of the farm,
as much cotton + as much wheat, as circumstances
will admit of in their judgments from the necessary
support of the family, and that they dispose of the above
articles in the manner they saw, or their judgment
will admit, and apply the money arising therefrom
to the payment of my debts. And last of all I constitute
+ appoint my dearly beloved Wife Nancy Stone, my very
good friends, Francis Coleman + Marshall Homack to be my
Executors to this my last Will + Testament, hereby revoke
any and disannulling all former Wills + Testaments
made or made by me at any time heretofore, declaring
this to be and no other my last Will + Testament. And I
do hereby invite my very good friends, David White,
Robert Cunningham to sign their names

Witnesses. In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand

of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen. The

intallined before signed.

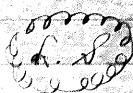
