I Item Second when my oldest child comes of age or has a proper
agent I will for her or either of them to have three hundred dol-
lars and also as my sons become of age for to have paid them
the same amount of money.

I Item the third If they should marry before the expiration of four
years I wish them to have a bed and furniture.

I Item fourth I do further Ordain I beloved wife Martha my Exe-
cutrix and Wm. Candler executor of this my last will and testament
in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this first day
of December 1825.

will and testament that she saw him execute it as such and

Oliver Benjamin Oliver & Sarah Oliver in the presence of John

said John Simmons was of mind perfectly sound and ration-
al at the time.
