After discharging the above mentioned demands
I give the balance of the money arising as
above mentioned to my Grand Children
Sarah Ann Gibson Joseph Laton Letna William
William Gibbons Saltenstall to be applied to
their education. Item I give and devise to my
son Joseph William Gibbons the sum of one
dollar. Item I give to my son Charles Gibbons
the sum of one dollar. Item I give and beque-
ath to my daughter Mary Saltenstall fol-
lowing property Amy Mariah Hagee Nancy and
Stephen One half of my stock of Hogs the choice
of my horses and the colt My riding chair
and horse coat the whole of my crop now
growing on the plantation the whole of the
provisions now on hand the whole of the
house hold and Kitchen furniture not other-
wise disposed of all of my plantation tools
the whole of my tract of land whereon I
reside to have and to hold her and her heirs
forever. Item I give to my grand daughter
Margaret Gibson the sum of one dollar I bequeath

one brother coadjutor to her former. I am I give
to my son Henry Gibbons my entire stock of
goats to him forever. Item my wish and
desire is that my daughter Mary Sattenstall
be my executrix to this my last will and
my son Henry Gibbons also my Executor

day of July one thousand eight hundred
