In the name of God Amen. I, Benjamin Daniel of
Laurens County, in the State of Georgia, being of sound
mind, memory and understanding, do hereby make and
ordain this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking
all former wills by me made, and establishing this as
the last and final disposition of my worldly goods, viz,
Imprimis - I order and direct all my just debts to be paid
as soon after my decease as convenient, and hereby direct
my Executor herein after named to discharge the same
without unnecessary delay. - Item, I hereby give devise
and bequeath unto my wife Lucy Daniel one third part
of all my property that I may die possessed of, for her life,
and after the death of my said wife, the said third
part so bequeathed as above to be divided equally between
the several persons herein after named, to whom the
residue of my Estate is devised and bequeathed.
Item, I hereby give and bequeath unto my daughter
Patsy Brantley, wife of Benjamin Brantley the sum
of twenty five dollars; and I hereby order & direct my
Executor herein after named to pay unto the said
Patsy Brantley the said sum of money as soon after my
decease as convenient.

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I am I hereby give and bequeath unto my son John
Daniel one share of the value of Fifty Dollars, one
Cow and half and the sum of ten dollars, and I do hereby
order and direct my said Executor herein after named
to deliver and pay unto the said John Daniel the said
several bequests as above.

I am, the rest residue and remainder of my Estate Real
personal or mixed, of whatever kind or nature, after
the payment and discharge the debts & legacies above
mentioned, I hereby devise and bequeath unto my son
William Daniel, my daughter Betty Brantly, my son
James Daniel and my son John Daniel, and my
grand Children Lucinda M. Daniel, Lucinda M. Daniel
and Andrew Jackson M. Daniel, the children of my
daughter Polly M. Daniel, wife of John M. Daniel
to be equally shared between them, share & share
alike, the Children of the said Polly M. Daniel
above mentioned to have one share equally divided
between them. - Lastly I hereby appoint my son
James Daniel sole Executor to this my last will
and Testament. - In Witness Whereof I have here
unto set my hand and affixed my seal this
day of January 1816 in the presence of

In the name of God, - Amos. Solomon Beddingfield
of the County of Laurens and State of Georgia, being in a
low state of health, though of a sound mind and memory
do constitute and Ordain this to be my last will and
Testament; in manner and form, following. Inprimis
I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elisabeth Bed-
dingfield the whole County of Land, Containing two
hundred two and a half Acres, that I now live on, number
one hundred and Eighty Six, to be hers during her lifetime
or widowhood, after her marriage or death, I give and
bequeath the said Lot of Land to my beloved son James
Beddingfield, to be his and his heirs forever, and one horse
Colt by the name of Tallow that I acknowledge to be my
beloved son James, that I give and bequeath to him at this
time, and seven Cows and their Calves - and then I
give and bequeath to my daughter Sally, Six Cows &
their Calves, and one feather Box and its furniture, and
half the Kitchen furniture, that I give to her and her heirs
forever. and all the rest of my Estate I give and bequeath
to my wife Elisabeth Beddingfield, real and personal, after
my debts is paid, during her life or widowhood, and
then to be equally divided between my two sons William
Beddingfield and Adam. - And lastly I appoint
James B. McCullers and my wife Elisabeth Beddingfield
my Executors to this my last will and testament, revoking
all other wills heretofore made, ratifying, allowing
and acknowledging this and this only to be my last
will and testament. In witness whereof I have set
my hand and seal, this twenty third day of September, one
thousand eight hundred and eighteen.
