ing do make this my last will and testament
in form and manner following (to wit) I
give my soul to Almighty God that gave it
and my body to be buried at the discretion of
of my Executors hereafter mentioned. Item
my desire is that all my just debts and funeral
charges be first paid then all my worldly goods
be disposed of in manner following (Item)
I lend to my dear and well beloved wife over join-
er one hundred acres of Land in the State of
North Carolina Nash County where my house
now stands or one hundred acres of Land in
the State of Georgia Laurens County by her having
her choice which she will choose to live on one
Negro Man by the name Dick and one Negro
Woman by the name of Bess one horse one
Feather bed during her natural life and after
her death to be disposed of in manner follow-
ing (Item) I lend to my dear and well beloved
daughter Rhoda Pitman one hundred acres
of Land lying on Sapponey Creek called by
the name of the Hart place and joining William
Baker Land on the Creek and after her death
I gave it to her children. I deny) I gave and
bequeath to my dear and well beloved son Willie
Joiner Four hundred acres of Land beginning
on the Marsh Branch and for sd Branch to
be the ~~North~~ and South line and from sd Branch
towards the Laurens County line

24 after the death of my wife once and one barrel
still one feather bed and furniture to him and
his heirs forever -- Item) I give and bequeath
to my dear and well beloved Elisabeth Lainer one
hundred acres of land b/c the Bowen Place
if I should get a good right to it and if
there is not a good right got to the land for
her to have three hundred dollars and ten
dollars to buy her a feather bed --

Item) I give and bequeath to my dear and
well beloved Sam Shadrach Lainer the
Remainder Part of my Land lying on the
River and the Island in the River and the Mill
and three hundred acres of land in the State of
Georgia Laurens County on the South Side of
the Oconee River one Large still one feather
bed and furniture the bed that now call'd his
to him and his heirs forever

Item) I give and bequeath to my dear and well
beloved daughter Terabra Lainer one Negro
Woman named Glac after her Mother's death and
one hundred dollars one feather bed and furniture
to her and her heirs forever

Item) I give and bequeath to my dear and well
beloved daughter Mary Lainer one Negro
Woman by the name of Name one feather
bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever

Item) I give and bequeath to my dear and well
beloved daughter Charity Lainer one Negro
Woman by the name of Lainer and

feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs
forever — and if I live or all of these
Negro Woman should have a child or chil-
dren in the term of my life for the said
Child or Children to be given first to
my son Shadrach Jainer the second to my
daughter Elisabeth Jainer and the third to
my son Willie Jainer the fourth to my daug-
hter Ferabra Jainer the fifth to my daughter
Mary Jainer the sixth to my daughter Charity
Jainer provided that these Children should
be born in my life time and if not in my
lif not to be so divided — and My desire is
that the Remainder part of my Estate be sold
and Equally divided Between my Wife Oner Jainer
and my seven Children to wit Rhoda Pitman Willie
Jainer Elisabeth Jainer Shadrach Jainer Ferabra
Jainer Mary Jainer Charity Jainer and I do
Constitute and appoint my Trusty friend C. r. r.
Jainer and my son Willie Jainer Executors to this
my last will and testament In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the
16th of February 1813
