I David Spear of the State of Georgia
and County of Laurens being in a low state
of health but in perfect sound memory
thank be to God but calling to mind
the mortality of man and apprehending
the speedy dissolution of my mortal frame
do think proper to make this and ordain
the same to be my last will & Testament
Killing all others previous to it and now
do recommend my soul into the hand
of almighty God who gave it to me and
my body to the dust from whence it came
and there to be decently entered by the executor
of this my last will and Testament whom
I shall appoint hereafter Item 1st I give
and bequeath my oldest son James Spear four
twenty dollar notes and James Ward of
Green County also fifty dollars extra of
that to be taken out of any property that
I have and further after all my just debts
is paid that he may have an equal share
of all my property and among the rest of
my legal heirs. Item 2nd It is my will
and desire that the perishable part of my
property be sold at twelve month credit
Item 3rd I have three beds with their furniture
which I value at thirty dollars each that I wish
to be disposed of in the following manner
Wiz One which I left with my daughter
Polly M. Palmore I give and bequeath to
her son David Palmore One other I give and
bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Duncan
and the third to my daughter Lucinda
Mary Spear I give and bequeath

My wearing apparel to be divided
between James Spear my son and David
Spear equally. And now lastly I
Nominate constitute and appoint my
beloved son James Spear my whole and
sole executor of this my last Will and
Testament Acknowledging this to be my
last Will and Testament Renouncing
all other heretofore made this the 5th day of
October 1820. In the 44th & 45 years of the
United States Independence. Signed with
my hand in the presence
