came into open Court and being duly sworn
saith that they saw Sophiah Mayall sign seal and
publish the within instrument to her last Will and
Testament and that she was of sound mind and
that they signed the same as witnesses

Second October 2nd 1830-

Georgia Laurens County - I George Payne of the
County and State aforesaid being weak in body but of sound
and disposing mind and memory and aware that it is appropriate
for all men to die do make and ordain this to be my last Will
and Testament -

In Witness Whereof I commit my soul to the care of almighty God
And I give and bequeath to my Wife Sally Payne the
following property (viz) One hundred acres of Ld. on
where I now live with all my buildings - Also the adjoining
square of Land that I bought from Daniel Thomas known
as the Piney woods square One Negro Girl known by the
name of Lucy five Cows and calves two beds of furniture
One Mare all my flock of Sheep all my Crockery ware
and China and boxes and forks the Saddle & Whistle
she has commonly used and twenty five dollars in Money
Item 2 - I give to my Daughter Lemmy Payne six Negroes
known by the following Names viz Chadwell James
Little Joss creasy Nelly Ned -

Item 3 I give to my three youngest Daughters Harriet Payne
Catherine Payne and Marietta Payne all the balance
of my land on Turkey Creek and when the youngest
of age or Marries then to be equally divided between
them and in case of the death of one or more known

Item 4 I Give - my grand son George one Negro
Woman named Abby to remain with his Mother
Elizabeth & to during her lifetime and then for him to
dispose of her as he may think proper

Item 5 I Give to my Daughter Martha Smith formerly
Martha Payne two Negroes Rachel & Poll

Item 6 I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary
Shivers formerly Mary Payne the three following named
Negroes Charles Fanny and her child & my -

All the balance of my property not before
named I wish sold on twelve Months credit and
after all my debts are paid I want my three young
children to have one hundred dollar each put on
interest and the balance of the money if there is any
remaining I wish equally divided between them Mary
formerly Mary Payne and Martha Smith formerly Martha
Payne - I hereby appoint Mr. Lusk judge Robert
Prozier and Eason Allen my Executors to carry
into effect this my last Will & Testament in Memory
hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 19th
of November 1830

I Young Woodard of the State of Georgia and County
of Laurens being in a low State of health but of a
perfectly Sound mind and disposing memory taking
into consideration the frailty of human nature and
that it is appointed for all men once to die do
make, make, constitute and appoint and establish
this my last will and testament that is I give and
bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Woodard my negro
boy Dick my negro woman Charity and her child
Elizabeth as much of the plantation as she may kneed
or want as many farming utensils and as much
house hold furniture as she may kneed or want
five cows and calves one half of my stock of
hogs my gray mare and her colt to have and hold
during her natural life and after her death to
belong to my beloved son Green Woodard forever in fee
simple I also give and bequeath unto my son
Green all the lands I own in the State except
the life estate already herein provided for my wife
and except one hundred acres of land that
I shall herein after dispose of also to my son
Green I give a negro boy named Henry a negro
boy named Onis a negro girl named Ruth ten
cows & calves and all the farming utensils
and house hold furniture that is not already here
given to my wife a roan horse called Lucy my
saddling (saddle) mare a barrel bladed faced cat
a two year old bone felly my set of Black
smiths tools and five beef sters to have and to
hold forever I give and bequeath unto my son
Woodard the land adjoining the land on
