I designed giving to him. I now proceed to divide
the Balance of my Estate in manner herein after
designated

2nd My will and desire is that out of my present
Crop of Cotton now on hand my Executors imme-
diately after my decease dispose of and pay all
my just debts

3rd I give and bequeath unto my wife Catharine
Spivey one third of all my Estate both real
and personal 4th I give and bequeath unto my
alford Benton Spivey one third of all my
Estate both real and personal and my watch
Extra

5th I Give and bequeath unto my daughter
Demaris Spivey one third all my Estate
both real and personal

6th My will and desire is as soon as practica-
ble after the present Crop be gathered for
the present year that my Executors sell all or such
part of my perishable property as they may think
proper and proceed to divide my Estate both
real and personal agreeable to the tenor of the
within will

7th I constitute and appoint my friends Hardy
J. Standley and John C. Coates Executors of this
my last will and testament hereby revoking
all and every other will or wills which I may
have made heretofore.

burial at the discretion of my Executors not doubting
but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same
by the mighty Power of God. And as touching such worldly
Estate where with it has pleased God to bless me with in
this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following
manner & form. I first of give and bequeath to John
B. Jones my dearly beloved wife during her life natural
life the plantation where on I now live & at the death
of her the said Rebecca Jones I will devise the same to be
and belong to my said wife & to her heirs & assigns together
with all the appurtenances thereunto in anywise by law
lawfully coming & after the death
