State of Georgia In the name of God Amen, I Jethro Weaver
Wilkinson County Ga. being weak in body, but of perfect
mind and memory, and knowing that it is appointed us for
all men to die, do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all recom-
end my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it me,
and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a
Christian like manner - As touching my worldly estate
which it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give
and dispose of in the manner and form following -
Supremacy My will and desire is that my beloved wife Lucy Wea-
ver have a comfortable support out of my Estate during her
life time. Item I give and bequeath to Martha Weaver
one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever.
Item I give and bequeath to my son John Weaver the lot
to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to
my daughter Lucy Eagle and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Phoebe Baker
One dollar to her and her heirs forever. - Item I give and
bequeath to my son Nathan Weaver, One hundred acres of land
it being a part of the survey or tract of Land now live on,
the same to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
to my son Jethro Weaver all the remainder of my Estate both
Real and Personal to him and his heirs forever.

Lastly, I nominate, Constitute, Ordain and Appoint my son
Nathan Weaver and my son Jethro Weaver Executors to this
my last will and Testament, revoking all other wills by me
formerly, acknowledging this and no other to be my last
will and testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal the tenth day of May
anno Domini 1806. Signed, sealed and acknowledged
