one year old calf, These Items above men-
-oned to my wife Daughter & Son are not
to preclude them from an Equal and Impartial
division of all my Real & personal property
It is my wish & desire that my Exutors Should
Sell my Real & personal property to the best
advantage and then make an Equal and Impar-
-tial division among my heirs, - I appoint
my true and trusty friends as Exutors to my
Last will & testament viz Joseph Livingston
Samuel Robison & Jesse Sayer & in testimony
hereof I set my hand and Seal this 18th May 1816

The above will of John Livingston du? was duly proven in open Court by the oath of Moses Wilson one of the Subscribing Witnesses. attest Amos Love c/k

In the name of God Amen I Willahy Manning of the State of Georgia and County of Laurens Being in perfect mind and Memory calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make and Ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following first of all I give my Soul in the hands of God that gave it, and Inhering my worldly Estate I give and bequeath in the following manner

Item the 1st my Will and desire is that my 1st debts be paid and that forty Dollars in the hands of my Brother Sander Manning with my Crop be apployed to that use I Item the 2^d I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife

Frauer Manning My Negro boy Lewis during her life or widowhood and at her death or Inter-marriage to belong to or descend to my beloved daughter Martha Manning, and farther I give to my wife one Bay Gilding with a tall fad one feather bed and furniture one chest and the ballance of my house hold furniture not other wise disposed of during her life to be disposed of as she may think proper
