In the name of God, Amen: I John Mannin of the
county of Laurens being very sick & weak in body but of per-
fect mind and memory thanks be given unto God; therefore
calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and know-
ing that it is appointed ~~for~~ all men once to die, do make
and ordain this my last will and testament, that to
say, principally and first of all I give & recommend my
soul into the hands of God that gave it; and my body
I recommend to the Earth to be decently buried at the
discretion of my executor, nothing doubting but at
the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty power of God, and as touching such
worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless
me with in this life, I give devise and dispose of in
the following manner and form

1st I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Mannen this absent from me, one dollar, to her and her heirs forever - 2nd I give unto one Mr. Drury Mannen one dollar, to him and his heirs and assigns forever without reserve or exceptions - And also five Cows and calves upon condition, that he sign a receipt to the satisfaction of my Executors, and not otherwise - 3rd I put into the possession at my death, of Henry Robinson and Eliza Gore all and singular my estate not otherwise disposed of, both real and personal and also the revenues thereof, administration and Laureate are all paid; then the balance of my estate to be given to Rachel Rogers by said Robinson and Gore. Then I declare, constitute, make and ordain my sole Executor of this my last will and Testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, annul, and every other former Testaments, Wills, legacies and bequests and Executors by me at any time before named, Will and bequeathed - Ratifying and confirming the and contents to my last Will and Testament - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 17th day of March 1813 - signed sealed, published and pronounced and declared by the said Mannen as his last will and Testament in the presence of us, and we in presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses to the same.

In the Name of God Amen, I James Cook, being of sound mind and memory, but in body this 8th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen do make this my last Will and Testament, I give my soul to God and my body to earth from whence it came - I then give to my wife & to my wife Patsy Cook my two negro fellows Laycock & Littlelow, during her widowhood, if she should marry, the said negroes to be hired out for the use of my children - I also give to my wife Patsy Cook my loved horse grey - I also give to my wife Patsy Cook one hundred bushels of Corn, and what meat I have in my smoke house, all the meat I have, one head and furniture, the bed and bedstead, two cows & pigs, all my kitchen furniture. I also give to my wife Patsy Cook one hundred and fifty bushels of Corn out of my crop that is growing on thousand Mt of Oak for her support the ensuing year, it is also my will and desire that my Executors should provide for my wife Patsy both a small place for her to live on, if to be had where she makes choice of - It I give to my son Henry Cook one loved mare, called Ginny, my saddle and Bridle, it is also my will and desire that my corral cart and my third horse, and land whereon I now live be sold and the money put to interest till my two sons become of age, & after B Cook and William Cook and then to be equally divided between them two - It I also give to Daughter Bridgman Cook one head and furniture the head and furniture of and one
