I give to my wife Mary Howland her feather
bed, bedstead and furniture that was hers before
I married her one horse worth about forty five dollars
four cows and calves one sow and pigs in shoats
and as much provision as will be sufficient to last
her until she can make

The balance of my property I wish sold and
the money when collected equally divided amongst
all my children.

I constitute and appoint my trusty friends Richard
Barlow and Eason Allen my Executors to carry in
to effect this my last will and testament Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
28th of February 1829

Deakins one of my executors to carry into effect this
