 S. Jonathan Woolly being of sound memory and in my
 perfect senses do think it best knowing that it is once ordain-
 ed for all men to die; I think proper to dispose of my prop-
 erty in the following manner, to wit, first I submit myself my
 whole body to the dust from whence it came. Secondly I
 give and bequeath to my loving son James Woolly the feather
 bed & now by me, to him and his heirs forever. Thirdly after
 all my just debts is settled I wish the residue of my pro-
 perty to be sold and equally divided among all my child-
 ren to wit; Elizabeth Eliza & Mary Woolly & Nancy Woolly
 and also William & James Woolly, I wish Nancy part
 to remain in the hands of the Executors for them to dis-
 posit her on as far as it will go and not to be cancelled
 into no other hands. In Witness whereof I appoint Lewis
 Holland & Wm Noel Executors to this my last will and

In the name of our Amen I wills of James Doolittle of Laurens County and State of Georgia being a male and fully conscious body, but a perfect mind I am now calling to mind the mortality of the body and that it is appointed for all men Once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, in manner and form as follows principally first of all I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God that guard it, and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors, not doubting to receive it at the great Resurrection by the Almighty power of God, and as for such worldly property as I have I leave God to endow me with in this life, & dispose of it in the following manner I bequeath my horse, bridle and saddle and my coat and one long, called the brown one and all my household furniture to my loving wife Nancy Solomon enduring her natural life or widowhood, and then to be equally divided among my children - After a division ~~made~~ with all the estate I make with the horse, then I give four of the best cows to my wife Nancy Solomon - And all the ^{rest} of my property to be sold by my Executors to settle my lawful debts - I do hereby nominate & appoint ^{James Doolittle and Nancy Solomon, my wife} Executors of this my last ^{will} and Testament, I do hereby revoke his and make void all other wills and Testaments heretofore by me made - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this
