Recorded January 22nd 1830 -

In the name of God Amen I Lucretia Daniel
being weak in body but of sound mind & memory do
make and ordain this my last will & Testament
First I give and bequeath to my Son John Daniel
two feather beds Bedsteads & furniture and all the
balance of my house hold and kitchen furniture
one Negro girl named Sarah about three years
old and all my stock of cattle to him & his heirs
forever
Secondly I give and bequeath unto my Son William Da-
niel one feather bed bedstead and furniture - to
him and his heirs forever
Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my Son William Daniel
and my Daughter Betsey Brantly one Negro woman
named Middy to be equally divided also I give to my
Daughter Betsey Brantly my wearing apparel to them &
their heirs forever
Fourthly I give and bequeath to my three Children
William Daniel John Daniel & Betsey Brantly
all that Lot of Land drawn by me in the last
Land Lottery to them and their heirs forever
Fifthly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
my two beloved Sons John Daniel & William Daniel
Executors of my last will and Testament

goods (viz) first of is my just debts which are all to
be paid out of my estate and then the remainder
