State of Georgia In the County of
Laurens County of me I Samuel
Kirkland of the State and County of record
being conscious of the uncertainty of the present
life and being desirous to dispose of and
arrange my affairs as to depart without undue
concern whenever it may please my maker to
call me hence do make this my last will
And Testament hereby revoking all things
To wit I devise my Pay house and crop
of Cotton to be appropriated to the Payment
of all my lawful debts and if they should
be insufficient I wish the balance to be
paid out of my Stock of Cattle and Hogs
Secondly I do give and bequeath unto myself
Sam. Kirkland An Negro Girl named
Rachel aged three years An black horse
One Cow and Calf and yearling the cow
named Hart and yearling thereof And her
in care and all the household furniture

which I have brought me an marriage all
which I hereby give to her use and behoof
Thirdly I hereby give and bequeath unto my
son J. M. Culler of Kirkland One negro man
Alloys aged thirty five years, One half of my stock
of Cattle and Hogs And One half of the
tract of land on which I now live containing
One hundred Sixty and a half Acres together
with One half of the Farming Utensils, Thrushy
I give and bequeath unto my son David
Kirkland One negro Woman named
Rose Aged thirty five years And her son
named Emperor aged Six years together
with all her furniture in crease One half of
my stock of Cattle And Hogs One Lone
Colt One half of the tract of land above
mentioned on which I now live One half
of the Farming utensils And one half of the
household and kitchen furniture &c &c
the other half to his brother J. M. Culler fifth
I give unto my son in law Charles Collwell
One dollar I do give and bequeath unto
my son Julius Kirkland the first draw
in the approaching Land Lottery in this
State & that I give and bequeath unto
my daughter Elizabeth Ballinger my
Lot to draw in the above mentioned
Land Lottery of this State and to be subject
itself to her own will and dispose
Thereby Any thing of which I may be
in possession and which is not herein
mentioned to her use and bequeath

to my sons M^cCallers and David to be
 equally divided between them. Eighthly
 provided my son David should depart
 this life before he attains to the age of twenty
 one years I hereby give and bequeath that
 part of the property herein allotted him
 to his brother M^cCallers and Julius and
 his Sister Elizabeth Ballinger to them
 only use and disposal. Ninthly I do hereby
 appoint Joseph Gaulton tall and my son
 M^cCallers Kirkland my Executors of this
 my last Will and Testament. In
 Witness whereof I have written at my hand
 and Seal this sixteenth day of March
 eight hundred and nine
