In the name of God, - Amos. I Solomon Beddingfield
of the County of Laurens and State of Georgia; being in a
low state of health, though of a sound mind and memory
do constitute and Ordain this to be my last will and
Testament; in manner and form, following. In presence
I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elisabeth Bed-
dingfield the whole Bounty of Land, Containing two
hundred two and a half acres, that I now live on, number
one hundred and eighty six, to be hers during her lifetime
or widowhood, after her marriage or death. I give and
bequeath the said lot of Land to my beloved son James
Beddingfield, to be his and his heirs forever, and one horse
Colt by the name of Tallow that I acknowledge to be my
beloved son James, that I give and bequeath to him at this
time, and seven Cows and their Calves - and then I
give and bequeath to my daughter Sally, Six Cows and
their Calves, and one feather Cow and its furniture, and
half the Kitchen furniture, that I give to her and her heirs
forever. And all the rest of my Estate I give and bequeath
to my wife Elisabeth Beddingfield, real and personal; after
my debts is paid; during her life or widowhood, and
then to be equally divided between my two sons William
Beddingfield and Adam: - And lastly I appoint
James M. Callers and my wife Elisabeth Beddingfield
my Executors to this my last will and Testament, revoking
all other wills heretofore made, ratifying, allowing
and acknowledging this and this only to be my last
will and Testament. In witness whereof I have set
my hand and seal, this twenty third day of September one
thousand eight hundred and seventeen.

and all the household furniture of every descrip-
tion whatever, all the corn and meat, during
her natural life; in order to raise my
