death do make and publish this my last will
and Testament as follows.

Item. I give unto my Son in Law James Blount
my one dollar in cash

Item. I give unto my son Abel Ryals one dollar
in cash

Item. I give unto my Son Travis Ryals one brown
wire calf.

Item. My will and desire is that my two sons
Gillis Ryals and James B Ryals to have my
Landable property that is three hundred acres
more or less lying on the water of Tightwater
Creek. Also two hundred acres on the water
of Wautons Creek all in the County of Laurens

Item. I give unto my Daughter Lucy Ryals one
mare Colt two Feather Beds & Steads of furniture
Linen head or Cattle the same that she has here
before claimed also one Loom

Item. My wish and desire is that after paying
for my burial expenses and all my just
debts out of the property not here before menti-
oned then an equal division to be made
between my said two ^{sons} Gillis Ryals and James
B Ryals of all the property whatsoever it
may consist of that I am lawfully possessor
of and hereby appoint my Son Gillis Ry-
als my sole Executor to this my last will
and Testament and at the same time
revoking all former Wills by me made

and disposing mind and memory and aware that it is appointed
for all men to die do make and ordain this to be my last Will
and Testament -

In Witness Whereof I commit my soul to the care of almighty God

First I give and bequeath to my wife Sally Payne the
following property (viz) One hundred acres of Ld. or
where I now live with all my buildings - Also the adjoining

square of Land that I bought from Daniel Thomas known
as the Piney woods square One Negro Girl known by the
name of Lucy five Cows and calves two beds of furniture
One Mare all my flock of Sheep all my Crockery ware
and China and Linen and forks the Saddle & Spittle
she has commonly used and twenty five dollars in Money
Item 2 - I give to my Daughter Lemmy Payne six Negroes
known by the following Names viz Charles James
little Jany creasy Nelly Ned -

Item 3 I Give to my three youngest Daughters Harriet Payne
Catharine Payne and Mariah Payne all the balance
of my Land on Turkey Creek and when the youngest
of age or Mariah then to be equally divided between
them and in Laurens County Will Book 1808-1840 page 100
