State of Georgia: In the name of God Amen
Laurens County I, Thomas Collins of the County and State
afore said being weak in body but of sound mind and
Memory thanks be to almighty God for the Grace and
calling to mind that it is appointed for all men to die
and after death to come to judgement. I therefore recom-
mend my soul in the hands of Almighty God who
gave it to me and say to the dust from whence it
came to be buried in a Christian like Manner
at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named
I do make this my last will and Testament in the
following Manner and form respecting my worldly
Goods (viz) first of it my just debts which are all to
be paid out of my Estate and then the remainder
of my estate to be disposed of in the following manner
I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah

a man named Jim a woman named Ann a boy named John
a girl named Rachel a boy named Jimmy a girl named
my a boy named Stephen son of Jim a girl named
a girl named Bess and a man named Joseph. I also
give unto my beloved wife Sarah Collier two head of horses
out of my stock of horses to be chosen by her for carriage
horses. I also give my beloved wife eight Cows and calves
two feather beds and furniture and bedsteads for the same
twelve sitting chairs one large Mahogany Table one side
Table one Mahogany Sideboard one Clock the one now in
the house all the Crockery ware of every description that
I now own one dozen Knives and forks six silver Table
Spoons six silver Teaspoons two large Iron pots one Iron
Tea Kettle one Kettle one Brass Kettle two Trunks one chest
two breeding Pows six ewes & lambs to have the grain for
her family ground toll free at my Mills for one year after
my death and a sufficient quantity of provisions of every
description that is on my plantation to support her and
her family and stock for the term of one year after my
death also Sugar and Coffee and Tea sufficient to sustain
her one year after my death which I leave my Executors
to be Judge of they having respect to the manner in which
she has been living. I also leave unto my beloved wife Sarah
Collier all my lands lying upon the South side of Rocky
Creek agreeable to the following Marks and boundaries
beginning at the Mill Pond where the lane across the tract to
the Pond and running with said Lane to the end of said Lane
thence a due South Course to the extreme part of my
lands except two acres to be laid out in the form of
an oblong running in the same direction with Rocky Creek
and Mill Pond adjoining my Mills all of which property
before mentioned I give unto my beloved wife Sarah Collier
her heirs and assigns forever.

and I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert Collier the following property (viz) nine Negro Slaves named as follows a man named Daniel a man named George a man named Ned a woman named Aggy a boy named John a woman named Charity a girl named Polly a boy named Mingo and a boy named Robert two feather beds and furniture eight Windsor Chairs one Mahogany Table five Cans and Calves five Cows and Lambs all of which property he has now in his possession

I also give unto my Son Robert Collier the following described Lands (viz) two tracts or parcels of lands lying and being in Twiggs County and State aforesaid on the West side of Turkey Creek known by the name of of the Underwood old place also two pieces of land in the twelfth district of formerly Houston now Pulaski County and State aforesaid upon the West side of the Okechouee River known and distinguished in the plan of said district by the lot number 276 two hundred and seventy six a fraction and Lot 273 two hundred and seventy nine which land I purchased and took a Deed in his name all which property I give to my Son Robert during his Natural life

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my Son Thomas Collier the following named Negro Slaves and other property (viz) twelve Negro Slaves and their increase Frank a man Thomas a woman Bony a girl Lettuce a girl Frank a boy Dick a man Phillis a woman Eliza a girl Jordan a boy Linnett a girl Toby a man and Adabella a girl also I give unto my Son Thomas Collier all my Lands lying and being in the twenty first district of formerly Wilkinson now Pulaski County known by the Lots Number three hundred and eighty three two and Lot number three hundred and eighty three known by the name of the Lacy place the Dance of the widow Eliza Peenall accepted in number three hundred and eighty three Also I give and bequeath unto my Son Thomas Collier the Lot Number two

ber (380) two hundred and eighty a square Lot Number
(386) two hundred and eighty six a fraction Lot Number
(385) two hundred and eighty five a fraction Lot Number
(389) two hundred and eighty nine a fraction one half
of the Lot Number 384 two hundred and eighty four which
was deeded by John Hawks all of which lies upon the
west side of the Cahulogee River in the County aforesaid
One tract in Decatur County in Gaia State known by the
Lot Number (117) one hundred and seventeen in the western
the district formerly Early New Decatur County and all
that part of Lot Number 373 two hundred and seventy two
lying on the north side of Town Creek in the twelfth
district of former Houston from Pulaski County and State
aforesaid All the above property I give unto my son William
Collins his heirs and assigns forever

a man I also give unto my son Byron Collins

state aforesaid on the South side of Roakey Creek first
beginning at the Mill Pond opposite my Lane thence along
said Lane to the end of it thence a due South Course
to Buckhorn Creek thence down the Creek as my
line runs may run to Roakey Creek thence up Roakey
Creek to the mouth of my Lane on the Mill Pond with
the exception of two acres laid out in the form of an
oblong adjoining my Mills and also an exception of
the above named Lands and buildings thereon which
I have loaned to my wife Sarah Collier during her
Natural life or widowhood tho' at the time of her death
or end of her widowhood to go to my son Bryan
W Collier. I do give and bequeath to my son Bryan
W Collier all my lands lying on the East side of my Lane
and North side of Roakey Creek consisting of the following
parts or parcels of Land in the State and County aforesaid
the Tract called the Cocksey Tract. One called the Leahy
Tract and the Allen Tract when my son Thomas Collier
commenced making a settlement One called the Nelson
Tract All my Land on Buckhorn all of which property
I give unto my son Bryan W Collier his heirs & assigns
forever.

east course to where it crosses Rockey Creek thence down

one called the Davis tract and other called the Buckhatter tract
which tract includes my Mills and two acres of Land lying
on the South side of Rockey Creek adjoining my Mills which
is to be laid out in the form of an oblong with the center oppo-
site said Mills I also give and bequeath to my son George
W Collier and Andrew Collier all my Land lying on the
east side of the Onnee River in the Counties of Laurens
and Montgomery and State aforesaid jointly known by the
name of the Upper Lands all of the above named property

Item 7th In addition to what I have given my beloved wife Sarah Collier I loan her the following named Negro Slaves a woman named Let during her natural life and after her death to belong to my son Robert Collier except the Negro woman Let who is to have choice which of my Children to live with and the one she makes choice of she shall belong to I also give unto my beloved wife Sarah Collier my four wheeled pleasure Carriage and five hundred dollars in Cash to be paid by my executor I also give unto my wife one Yoke of Oxen to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Item 8th I give unto my son Bryan W Collier one large pair of new Mill Stones

Item 9th It is my Will and desire that my three youngest Sons Bryan W Collier George W Collier & Andrew Collier be sent to School and their board and Tuition be paid out of the Money which may be due me either by Note Bond accounts receipt or otherwise to the amount of one thousand dollars to be collected and paid over by my executor and in case the same should not be collected then the amount to be raised out of the Money arising from the proper sold at my vendue.

Item 10 My Will respecting of Stock of Cattle is that I want them to be divided into five equal Shares and for my son Thomas Collier to draw one fifth part of the Cattle then the others to be kept together untill my son Steadham W Collier shall be come of age then for him to draw one fourth part then the others to be kept together untill my son Bryan W Collier shall become of age then for him to draw one third part then the rest to be kept together and be divided equally between my two sons

feather bed and furniture I will to my son Newham Collier
one feather bed and furniture to my son Bryan Collier
one feather bed and furniture to George W. Collier one
bed and furniture and to Andrew Jackson Collier one
feather bed and furniture - I will to my son George

ever he makes choice of.

Item 11th I give and bequeath to my son George W. Collier
one negro man named old Stephen and it is my
desire that he should take care of said negro Stephen
so long as he may live and see he does not suffer for
any the comfort of life necessary for his support and it is
further my will that my said son do pay unto the said
negro man Stephen the sum of ten dollars to be paid annu-
ally after my decease or when the said negro Stephen
shall be put in his possession and farther it is my will
that the said negro Stephen for the above consideration
shall live with and serve my son.

Item 12th I give and bequeath to my son Newham W.
Collier in addition to what I have given him My Mill
Mill house together with lands which the water for the sup-
port of the mills may cover together with two acres
of land lying and being immediately opposite said Mills
being in town of formerly Houston now Palestine and State
aforesaid upon the west side of Satomulgee River
to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item 13th And my will is that all the residue of my estate
not otherwise disposed of in this will be sold and the
money arising from such sale be equally divided
amongst my five youngest sons Thomas Collier Newham
Collier Bryan Collier George W. Collier Andrew Jackson
Collier to the

Senior Thomas H. Wilkinson Thomas Collier & Bradburn
 W. Collier my Executors to this my last Will & Testament
 Writly revoking all former Wills or Wills or any instru-
 ment of writing purporting to be a Will acknowledging
 this instrument of writing to be my last will and Testa-
