Record the 11th day of March 1817—

In the name of God Amen, I Thomas Farmer
of the County of Laurens and State of Georgia being
of Sound and disposing mind and memory but calling
to mind the mortality of the Body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die, do
make and ordain this my Last will and Testament
and first of all I recommend my Soul into the
hands of Almighty God, and my body to be buried
at the discretion of my Executors, who I shall
hereafter name - and as touching such worldly property
as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this
life, I give and demise in the following manner,
to wit, my wish and desire is that all my Just
debts be paid & fully discharged.

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Eliza-
beth Farmer my Land and Plantation whereon
I now live with all and singular the rights members
and appurtenances therunto belonging to her and her
heirs forever. —

Item I give and bequeath to my brother Joseph
Farmer one dollar to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my brother Jesse
Farmer one dollar to him and his heirs forever

32 } Item, I give and bequeath to the legal heirs of
my deceased brother Sophus Farmer one dollar to them
and their heirs forever —

Item I give and bequeath to the legal heirs of my sister
Elizabeth Barefoot deceased, Formerly Elizabeth Farmer
one dollar to them & their heirs forever —

Item I give and bequeath to my sister Naomi Farmer
or her legal representatives or heirs one dollar
to her or them and their heirs forever —

Item - I give and bequeath to my sister Pally Farmer
one dollar to her & her heirs forever —

Item - my wish and desire is that after my
decease my Executors herein after named should
proud to sell such of my personal property as
my said wife Elizabeth Farmer may think she
can best spare, or to such an amount as shall
be sufficient to discharge all my last debts
and the legacies herein before made to my Brothers
& Sisters their heirs or representatives, which said
legacies are to be paid at any time when called
for after twelve months from my decease —

Item - I give and bequeath to my said wife Elizabeth Farmer
all the balance of my Estate both real & personal
which I may be possessed of let the same consist in what
~~it~~ may whether Lands, or monies, Stock, furniture
Tools or property of any other kind or description
whichever to her and her heirs forever —

And Lastly I hereby nominate constitute & appoint
my beloved wife Elizabeth Farmer and my Friend
Jonathan Pope Sole Executrix and Executor to this
my Last will and testament revoking all wills or testaments
thereto fore made by me, & ratifying this, and this only to be
my true Last will & Testament

Recorded the 22nd day May 1814 —

In the name of God Amen. I, Benjamin Daniel of
Laurens County, in the State of Georgia, being of sound
mind, memory and understanding, do hereby make and
ordain this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking
all former wills by me made, and establishing this as
the last and final disposition of my worldly goods, viz,
Imprimis — I order and direct all my just debts to be paid
as soon after my decease as convenient, and hereby direct
my Executor herein after named to discharge the same
without unnecessary delay. — Item, I hereby give devise
and bequeath unto my wife Lucy Daniel one third part
of all my property that I may die possessed of, for her life,
and after the death of my said wife, the said third
part so bequeathed as above to be divided equally between
the several persons herein after named, to whom the
residue of my Estate is devised and bequeathed.
Item, I hereby give and bequeath unto my daughter
Patsy Brantly, wife of Benjamin Brantly the sum
of twenty five dollars; and I hereby order and direct my
Executor herein after named to pay unto the said
Patsy Brantly the said sum of money as soon after my
decease as convenient.
