In the name of God Amen I William Manning
of the State of Georgia and County of Laurens,
Being in perfect mind and Memory calling
to mind that it is appointed for all men
once to die, Do make and Ordain this my last
will and testament in manner and form fol-
lowing first of all I give my Soul in the
hands of God that gave it, And Inshing
my worldly Estate I give and bequeath in the
following manner

Item the 1st my Will and desire is that my if it
debts be paid and that forty Dollars in
the hands of my Brother Landry Manning
with my Crop be apployed to that use

Item the 2^d I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife

Frauer Manning My Negro boy Lewis during
her life or Widowhood and at her death or
Intermarriage to belong to or descend to my
beloved daughter Martha Manning, and
farther I give to my wife One Bay Gilding
with a ball and one feather Bed and furne-
ture one Chest and the ballance of my house-
hold furniture not ather wise disposed of
during her life to be at her disposal

Item the 3^d I give and bequeath unto my beloved Child
Martha Manning one Parcel Gilding one
Feather Bed and furniture one Chest one note
of hand on Isaac Hill for two hundred and
the balance of Money arising from my crops
if any after paying my Just debts, in order
to Train School and Support her and also
my Negroe Woman Slave by the name of Milly

Item the 4th I do hereby nominate and appoint my loving
and trusty friend Col^o. Archibald Griffin sole
Executor to this my Last will and testament to
act for me and in my name and stand touching
all and singular my Estate Intestimonies whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 18th
day of April 1816
