principally first of all I give and bequeath my soul into
the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body to
the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at
the discretion of my Executors, not doubting to receive it
at the great resurrection by the Almighty power of
God, and as for such worldly property as it has pleased
God to endow me with in this life, I dispose of it in
the following manner - I bequeath my horse, bridle
and saddle and my cow and one sow, called the house
- cow and all my household furniture to my loving
wife & Nancy Solomon enduring her natural life or
widowhood, and then to be equally divided among
my children - After a division ~~is made~~ with all
children is made with the above, then I give four of the
best hogs to my wife & Nancy Solomon - And all the
^{infer} rest of my property to be sold by my Executors to settle
my lawful debts - I do hereby nominate & appoint
Jesse & Indreah and Nancy Solomon (my wife) Executors
of this my last ^{will} and Testament, I do hereby revoke dis
annul and make void all other wills and Testaments
heretofore by me made - In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this

In presence My will and desire is that my beloved wife Lucy Weaver have a comfortable support out of my Estate during her life time - Item I give and bequeath to Martha Weaver one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever.
Item I give and bequeath to my son John Weaver one dollar to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Weaver one dollar to her and her heirs forever.
