I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary  
Spill two feather Beds bedsteads and furniture  
one Negro woman Sylvia also one gray horse  
and one bay Mare also four cows and yearlings  
and all the glasses and crockery ware and Kitch-  
en furniture and two chests and two tables also  
the land Mill and plantation whereon I now  
live to be hers during her natural life and  
after her death to be divided William Spill  
and John Buddle Spill.

I also desire and request that all my property  
real and personal to be divided between William  
Spill and John Buddle Spill.

I also desire and request that my Executors  
will immediately sell all my perishable property

I also desire and request that my Executors  
will dispose of my lands as they think proper  
for the benefit of William Spill and John  
Buddle Spill except what is bequeathed

I also desire and request my Executors to  
pay and discharge all the debts due from  
me also to collect all the debts due from me  
and the remainder of my debts due me  
to be put to the benefit of William Spill and  
John Buddle Spill being the off

Oliver and M Daniel Oliver my Brother  
my Executor and Executors in Whitgift wharf  
I have hereunto sett my hand and seal this  
second day of May in the year eighteen hundred  
and eleven
