The Will of Benjamin Ramsey, deceased,  
State of Georgia, B. J. Benjamin Ramsey of said State & County,  
Lee County, being feeble in body, but of sound mind  
disposing, sound and voluntary, do make pub-  
lish and declare this my Last Will & Testament,  
hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me,

Item 1<sup>st</sup>: I give and bequeath to my daughter Mrs.  
Penelope Lewis and Mrs. Martha Freeman,  
Lot of Land Number One Hundred & Forty three,  
(143) in the Second District (2) of said County,  
to be equally partitioned off, and the half  
falling to each. I give and bequeath to them  
for and during their natural lives, and at their  
death to such Child or Children as they may  
leave living at their death, and in no  
event to be subject to their debts, and contracts  
or liabilities, or to the debts, Contracts or Liabilities of  
any husband they may have. —

Item 2<sup>nd</sup>: I give and bequeath to my Son Henry K.  
Ramsey, Lot of Land Number One Hundred  
Forty Seven (147) in the Second District (2<sup>nd</sup>)  
of said County, together with all the improve-  
ments on the same, and negro boy, Elieko,  
about Eleven years old, to have and to hold  
them during his natural life, and at his  
death to such Child or Children as he may  
leave living at his death, or may be born  
within the usual period of gestation after

but in no event to be subject to his debts, Contracts or Liabilities. I further give and bequeath to him in fee simple, my beaten Colored Horse Bellamy, One Bed and Furniture, my Small yoke Oxen and Cart, One Cow and Calf, and one sow and Piggy.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>: I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca A. Ramsey, Daughter of David Ramsey One Hundred and forty Eight (148) in the Second District of said County, and sugar girl Jacqueline, about eleven years of age, for and during the natural life of my said daughter, and at her death to such Child or Children, as she may leave living, and, said David and meag or in no event to be subject to the debts, Contracts or Liabilities of my said daughter, or any interest she may have, I further give to my said Daughter in fee simple two Cows and Calves, One Bed and furniture and One sow ~~Lee County Wills~~ and I further will and desire that, my <sup>1854-1891</sup> Daughter as long as she remains single ~~Lee County Wills~~ remain and live in the house where I now live. It is further my Will and desire, and I hereby bequeath, with the Stock of Feed herein given to my said Daughter, all the improvements on the same, including the Gin-House and Screw, and the Sugar-Mill and Boilers, but my Son Henry is to have the use of them as long as my said Daughter lives in the house with him, -

Item 4<sup>th</sup>: It is my Will and desire that all of my other negroes not herein otherwise disposed of be equally divided, Share and Share alike between my Daughter Penelope Pleasant, Martha Freeman, Rebecca A. Ramsey, and my Son Henry Lee Ramsey, and my Grand-Daughter Leanna Elizabeth Ramsey, Daughter of my deceased Son Benjamin Ramsey, the share following to each, to them for and during their lives, and at their death to such Child or Children as they may leave living at their death, in no event to be subject to their

debts, contracts, or liabilities, or the debts, contracts or liabilities of any husband they may have, And Should any said Grand-Daughter die without leaving Child or Children surviving her; Then I desire her said share of my property to be equally divided between my said Children, or their Representatives, and I hereby appoint my friend Jesse Tucker, of said County Trustee for my said Children & Grand-Children, —

I desire my Executor hereinafter appointed to sell all my other property not otherwise disposed of by this will, at such time after my death and under such circumstances either privately or publicly as may in his judgment be deemed best, and with the proceeds pay my just debts, and the balance after the payment of my debts I wish equally divided between my Daughters Mrs. Philelope Carroll and Mrs.

Marttha Freeman, and said balance does not exceed Two Thousand Dollars, and in the event it does, I desire the said excess to be equally divided between my Daughter Philelope Carroll, Martha Freeman, Rebecca A. Ramsey, and my Son Henry L. Ramsey, my object in giving my two Daughters Mrs. Carroll & Mrs. Freeman, the two thousand Dollars, in the event of there being that much is, to make them up the difference in the Land, as nearly as I can. If in the opinion of my Executor it shall be thought best to postpone a sale of my other property herein mentioned he shall keep up my plantation until such sale & not pay off the Legacies, or give off the property until after the sale, I desire such money as I may have on hand at my death and such as may be collected from debts due me, to be paid with the proceeds of the sale of the aforesaid property, and disposition of my fine in this
