

Will of Charles Williams.

Georgia - I, C. Charles Williams of said County, being of advanced age, and being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make this my Last Will and Testament, revoking all others heretofore by me made, -

Item the 1st - I will and direct that my body be buried in a Christian-like manner. -

Item the 2nd - I Will and direct that, all of my just debts be paid by my Executor hereinafter named. -

Item the 3rd - I give and bequeath to my daughter Richarda Drake, one acre of land for a home for her & her children. Said land described as follows to-wit: To be in the South-East corner of half lot of land No. (60) Sixty, it being the East-half of said lot of land No. (60) Sixty, in the 13th District of said County. Said acre of land to begin at the South-East corner, and run North One-Half of an Acre thence West Two acres, and thence South One-Half of an Acre to the starting place, -

Item the 4th - I give and bequeath to my Son Dennis Williams, and my daughter Mary Wright, and my daughter Harriet Wright, & my daughter Julia Williams, the East Half of Lot of Land No. (60) Sixty in the 13th District of Lee County, and known as my Home-Place; all of said land except that I have Willed away in the 3rd Item of this my Will; they to have the said land jointly and the same to be a home for them and their children; and if the said Dennis Williams should die within a year then the property given to him to be the property of the said Mary, Harriet & Julia, and their heirs jointly. -

Item the 5th - I give and bequeath to my Son Dennis Williams, my daughters Mary Wright, Harriet Wright, and Julia Williams, my mares & mules, and my Two-Horse Wagon, and all of my farming tools, on my Home-Place, & on the East-Half of Lot of Land No. (60) Sixty, in the 13th District of said County, -

district of Lee County, and I give to said Dennis, Mary Harwick, and Julia, all of my Corn and fodder, fence & potatoes, and all of my Crops that is now on and growing on said East-End of Lot of land No 601 in the 13th District of Lee County, -

in the 6th = I Will and direct that all of the property devised & disposed of in the 5th of my Will be kept together for my said children, a Homestead until the youngest one of the children now born becomes of age,

in the 7th = I give & Bequeath to my Son Dennis Williams, & my daughters Mary Wright, Harwick Wright, & Julia Williams, all of my Household and Kitchen Furniture, -

in the 8th = I Will and direct that all of the residue of my property not heretofore disposed of, I give to my Son Dennis Williams, and my daughters Mary Wright, Harwick Wright, & Julia Williams, -

in the 9th = I hereby appoint & constitute my daughter Julia Williams, & ^{Lee County Wills} ¹⁸⁵⁴⁻¹⁸⁹¹ ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} my Executor of my last will & Testament, this the 11th day of May 1886.
