

Will of Charles Williams,

Georgia - I, C. Charles Williams of said County, being of legal age, and being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make this my Last Will and Testament, revoking all others heretofore by me made, -

Item the 1<sup>st</sup> - I will and direct that my body be buried in a Christian-like manner. -

Item the 2<sup>nd</sup> - I will and direct that, all of my just debts be paid by my Executor hereinafter named. -

Item the 3<sup>rd</sup> - I give and bequeath to my daughter Richarda Drake, one acre of land for a home for her or her children. Said land described as follows to-wit: To be in the South-East corner of half lot of land No. (60) Sixty, it being the East-half of said lot of land No. (60) Sixty, in the 13<sup>th</sup> District of said County. Said acre of land to begin at the South-East corner, and run north one-half of said distance West Two acres, and thence south ~~two~~ distance East to the starting place,

Item the 4<sup>th</sup> - I give and bequeath to my Son Dennis Williams, and my daughter Mary Wright, and my daughter Harriet Wright, and my daughter Julia Williams, the East-half of Lot of Land No. (60) Sixty, in the 13<sup>th</sup> District of Lee County, and known as my Home-Place; all of said land except that I have Willed away in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Item of this my Will; they to have the said land jointly and the same to be a home for them and their children; and if the said Dennis Williams should die without issue then the property given to him to be the property of the said Mary, Harriet & Julia, and their heirs jointly. -

Item the 5<sup>th</sup> - I give and bequeath to my Son Dennis Williams, my daughters Mary Wright, Harriet Wright, and Julia Williams, my mares & mules and my Two-Horse Wagon, and all of my farming tools, on my Home-Place, & on the East-half of Lot of Land No. (60) Sixty, in the 13<sup>th</sup> District of Lee County, Georgia.

the 6<sup>th</sup> = I Will and direct that all of the property descended & disposed of in the 50<sup>th</sup> Item of my Will be kept together for my said Children, a Homestead till the youngest one of the Children now born become of age.

the 7<sup>th</sup> = I give & Bequeath to my Son Dennis Williams, my daughters Mary Wright, Harwick Wright, & Julia Williams, all of my Household and Kitchen Furniture, -

the 8<sup>th</sup> = I Will and direct that all of the residue of my property not heretofore disposed of, I give to my Son Dennis Williams, and my daughters Mary Wright, Harwick Wright, & Julia Williams, -

the 9<sup>th</sup> = I hereby appoint & constitute my daughter Julia Williams, & son Law Wesley Drake, my Executors & Executors in my last will & Testament, this the 11<sup>th</sup> day of May 1886.
